SUPPORTING CLIMATE-RESILIENT INCOME GENERATING ACTIVITIES empowers women and ensures active participation in adaptation activities



INCORPORATING GENDER-RESPONSIVE MEASURES AND CONSIDERATIONS IN THE EARLY DESIGN PHASE, such as specific evaluation indicators or baseline assessments, is cost-effective and essential for measuring success



In Haiti, women have become active members of Watershed Management Committees and have provided new perspectives for adaptation, such as selecting fruit trees for reforestation activities to help address food security.
